### New School Year, New Protocols Short Form of Minimal COVID Procedures

We have been diligently working on our COVID Safety Policy designated by WorkSafe BC to reopen our doors. This plan has been printed out and hung on our bulletin boards. Below is a simplified version, please read through to become familiar with the changes.

- ♦ All persons entering the building MUST wash their hands with soap and water before and after their lesson.
- ♦ It is recommended to wear a mask in the common areas and in the hallways, as physical distance cannot be guaranteed.
- Students will not be able to sit and wait for a lesson in the hallways. The intent is for each student to arrive just a couple of minutes before a lesson begins and wait in the hallway, close to their lesson door.
- Parents are being asked to stay out of the building unless requested to attend a lesson. If this is the situation, the parent is required to maintain at least 6 feet from the instructor. Instructors may ask parents to wear a mask. This is up to the instructor.
- Siblings may sit within the parent's bubble if absolutely necessary. This will be two bubbles, the family is one and the instructor the other.
- Teachers are asked to wipe down the piano, piano bench as well as any table or chair that is used.
- If any chairs or music stands are used in one of the large rooms, they need to be sanitized after use with the spray bottle provided.
- ♦ To minimize contact, please register and pay by phone as much as possible. If you are paying by cheque(s), feel free to slide it/them in an envelope under the office door, or leave them in the mailbox out front of the building.
- Students who are sick cannot come to the music school for their lesson. If they choose and the teacher agrees, lessons can be taught online during their lesson time or at another arranged lesson time. If you have a student who is sick please ask them to stay home and reassess their health for their next lesson. The student DOES NOT have to wait 14 days to come back to the school, if they do not have COVID. If he/she feels better the next week for their lesson, they are more than welcome to come back.

\*Our cleaner is in daily to clean the main areas of both buildings. She cleans railings, door knobs, light switches etc. as well, of course, the washrooms.

We know that this year is going to look a bit different, but we are very optimistic that we are going to have a great year! We thank you for your patience and remaining calm, as we get through this together. Let's get started!
