


### SPOOKTACULAR FUN!

## Congratulations, Imant!

Our very own Vernon Community Music School violin teacher, Imant Raminsh, just celebrated a momentous birthday in September - and to commemorate his birthday, his home country of Latvia invited him for a concert trip to honour his music. Below is the write up from Latvian Public Media, introducing Imant and all of his accomplishments.

"Live from the Ventspils concert hall
"Latvija" – the 80th anniversary concert of
composer Imant Raminsh , the first part of
which featured a cappella choral works,
and the second part – the Latvian premiere
of the Violin Concerto with a solo by Laura
Zariṇa (violin) and Viktorija Majora
(soprano), as well as Psalm 104. I will sing
to the Lord". Māris Sirmais, conductor of
the State Academic Choir "Latvija" and the
Liepāja Symphony Orchestra .

The composer was born on September 18, 1943 in Ventspils. His family fled into exile in Germany in 1944 and came to Canada in 1948. They settled in Cochrane, Ontario. Imant's violin teacher in Toronto was Albert Pratz and he attended Jarvis Collegiate Institute. He received an ARTC diploma from the Royal Toronto Conservatory in violin, and his undergraduate degree was a BMus

After studying music in Salzburg, he returned to Canada and went to Prince George, British Columbia, where he founded the music department at the College of New Caledonia and worked there until 1972. Founded the New Caledonian Chamber Orchestra (1971), which was renamed the Prince George Orchestra in 1981, the Okanagan Youth Symphony Orchestra (1989), the Nova Children's Choir (1983), the Aura Chamber Choir (1979). He has been an active presenter of discussions and symposia at conferences dedicated to choral music (e.g. at the World Choral Music Festival in Vancouver). Since 1977, he has been a teacher at the Vernon Community Music School. He was the Choral Director of the OSO Chorus from 1978 to 1982 and a principal player from 1978 until the early 2010's.

Imant's music has been performed on all continents by many prominent musicians and groups. Among the most important commissioned works are the Violin Concerto composed for the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, the Bassoon Concerto for George Zuckerman and "Sonnets to Orpheus" for the Toronto Orpheus Choir, as well as large-scale works for the St. Lawrence Choir in Montreal and the Mendelssohn Choir in Toronto. As a conductor, he participated in performances of several works by himself and other contemporary composers. He was the laureate of the Karl Gopper Foundation (2005). Received Okanagan Music Award (2011)." In 2007, Imant received the Latvian Order of the Three Stars, and in 2018 he received the Order of Canada.
